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**COURSE DESCRIPTION**

**HAW 401 Fourth-Level Hawaiian (3)** Advanced reading, writing, and discussion in Hawaiian. Transcribing and translating Hawaiian language tapes. Translating English into Hawaiian, and Hawaiian into English. Pre: 302 or exam, or consent.

**NĀ PAHUHOPU O KĒIA PAPA (SLOs)**

Ke puka ka haumāna mai kēia papa, e pa‘a ana iā ia:

- ka heluhelu, ka ho‘omaopopo, a me ka ho‘oholomua ‘ana i ka ‘ike a me ka ‘ōlelo i pa‘a ma nā puke mo‘olelo ‘elua i helu ‘ia ma luna a‘e nei
- ka ‘ike lihi ‘ana i ka huina kā‘oko‘a o ka mo‘olelo Hawai‘i, a me ka nohona o kēia mau mo‘olelo i loko o ia huina nui
- ka ukama‘ilio ‘ana me nā hoa papa, nā kumu, a me nā mānaleo, me ka hiki ke kūkākūkā e pili ana i nā mana‘o kūhohonu o ka ‘ike, ka nohona, a me ka ‘ōlelo kanaka, ma ka ‘ōlelo makuahine
- ka unuhi pili pono ‘ana i nā ‘ano pilina ‘ōlelo e pono ai kona kūlana
- ka hiki ke kākau i ka ‘ike a me ka mana‘o i loa‘a iā ia, me ka mōakāka a me ke kūlana kūpono
- ka pilina hemo ‘ole o ka ‘ōlelo a me ka nohona a ka Hawai‘i.

**NĀ HA‘AWINA O KA PAPA**

‘Elua ‘ano māhele o kēia papa: 1) no ka ho‘oma‘ama‘a pilina ‘ōlelo, a me ka 2) no ka heluhelu ‘ana i kekahi mau mo‘olelo no Poli‘ahu, ka wahine noho anu. E ho‘onohonoho ‘ia ana ka papa ma o kēia mau papahana ‘elua, a e lele ana mai kekahi i kekahi. ‘O ia ho‘i, ‘ekolu pule no ka

ho‘oma‘ama‘a pilina ‘ōlelo, a laila ‘ekolu pule no ka heluhelu ‘ana i ka mo‘olelo ‘o *Hi‘iaka*, a pēlā nō. Eia nā ha‘awina i pili i nā māhele ‘elua o ka papa:

### **No ka ho‘oma‘ama‘a pilina ‘ōlelo.**

**Nā ha‘awina pilina ‘ōlelo:** E loa‘a ana nō he mau ha‘awina unuhi a haku mo‘olelo ho‘i no ka ho‘oma‘ama‘a ‘ana a me ke a‘o ‘ana i nā pilina ‘ōlelo e pono ai ka haumāna makahiki ‘ehā. E nānā ‘ia nō e ke kumu i ka ho‘omaka ‘ana o ka papa, i loa‘a ka ‘ai i ka haumāna nāna i ho‘opau aku. (*‘ai*)

**Ka Hō‘ike:** E loa‘a ana kekahi mau hō‘ike no ka ho‘opa‘a pono ‘ana i nā pilina ‘ōlelo e a‘o a ho‘oma‘ama‘a ‘ia. E ho‘olaha mua ‘ia kekahi, a ho‘olaha ‘ole ‘ia kekahi. Aia ma ke ka‘ina papa nā hō‘ike e ho‘olaha ‘ia. (*kaha ‘ia*)

### **No ka Heluhelu Mo‘olelo no Poli‘ahu.**

**Ka Hō‘ano Hou:** Ma hope o ka heluhelu mua ‘ana i kekahi māhele o ka mo‘olelo, e ho‘okuleana ‘ia kēlā me kēia haumāna i ka hō‘ano hou ‘ana i kekahi ‘āpana pōkole o ua māhele nei. ‘O ia ho‘i, ke kikokiko hou ‘ana i ka mo‘olelo, me ka ho‘okomo ‘ana i ka ‘okina me ke kahakō, a me ka pela ‘ana i nā hua‘ōlelo e like me ka mea i ma‘a i kēia au. (*kaha ‘ia*)

**Ka Papa Hua ‘Ōlelo:** Na ka haumāna e mālama i kāna papa hua ‘ōlelo pono‘ī. Ma laila e helu papa ‘ia ai a e unuhi ‘ia ai nā hua ‘ōlelo hou a me nā ‘ōlelo no‘eau i ‘ike ‘ia ma nā mo‘olelo a ka papa e heluhelu ana. (*‘ai*)

**Ka Unuhi Mo‘olelo:** E unuhi ana ka haumāna i kekahi mau māhele o kēia mau mo‘olelo. (*kaha ‘ia*)

**Nā Pepa Li‘ili‘i:** I ka hopena o ka wā heluhelu, e kākau ana ka haumāna i kekahi pepa (2 ‘ao‘ao ka pōkole loa). Ma loko o laila, e ho‘ohana ‘ia nō nā pilina ‘ōlelo i a‘o a ho‘oma‘ama‘a ‘ia. (*kaha ‘ia*)

**Pepa Li‘ili‘i #1:** E pane ‘ia kekahi nīnau a ke kumu e hāpai ai. E pili ana kēia nīnau i nā mokuna a kā David Malo puke i heluhelu ‘ia ma ka papa. (*Palena pau: 24 Kepakemapa*)

**Pepa Li‘ili‘i #2:** E huki ‘oe i kekahi hunahuna ‘ike mai loko mai o nā mo‘olelo no Poli‘ahu, a e ‘imi i ‘ike hou aku no ua mea nei. Wehewehe ‘ia maila ma kēia pepa, a kuhikuhi ‘ia ‘elua a ‘oi kumu ‘ike. (*Palena pau: 29 ‘Okakopa*)

**Nā Ha‘i ‘Ōlelo:** E hō‘ike mai ana nō ho‘i ka haumāna i ka ‘ike i loa‘a iā ia ma ka pepa Ho‘onui ‘Ike, ma ke ‘ano he ha‘i ‘ōlelo. (*kaha ‘ia*)

**Ka Papahana Kau:** E haku ka haumāna i mea e hō‘ike‘ike a ha‘i hou ai i kekahi māhele o ko Poli‘ahu mo‘olelo, i kāko‘o ‘ia e ka hana kālai ‘ōlelo me ka hana ‘imi noi‘i o kēia papa. I la‘ana, e hana paha ka haumāna i: puke li‘ili‘i, wikiō, podcast, haku mele, ‘ao‘ao pūnaeweles, a pēlā aku. E hana pū ke kumu no ka ho‘okele pono ‘ana i kēia papahana. (*kaha ‘ia*)

## Nā Koina ‘E A‘e

**Ka Puke Ha‘awina.** E mālama ‘ia nā ha‘awina a pau o ka papa i kekahi puke lina kolu. E nānā ‘ia nō ka puke e ke kumu, a hā‘awi ‘ia ka ‘ai no ka mālama pono ‘ana aku. (‘ai) Eia nā māhele o ua puke nei:

Nā mo‘olelo: nā pepa kumu o nā mo‘olelo e heluhelu ‘ia ana

Ka hō‘ano hou ‘ana: nā paukū āu i kikokiko hou ai, me nā ‘okina & kahakō

Ka papa hua ‘ōlelo: nā hua ‘ōlelo hou a me nā ‘ōlelo no‘eau i loa‘a ma nā  
mo‘olelo e heluhelu ‘ia

Nā ha‘awina pilina ‘ōlelo

Ka unuhi mo‘olelo

Nā pepa li‘ili‘i

Nā hō‘ike

Nā mea ‘ē a‘e: nā palapala loiilo ha‘i ‘ōlelo, nā palapala kipa mānaleo, a pēlā aku

**Ke Kipa Mānaleo.** Koi ‘ia ke kipa ‘ana o ka haumāna i ka Lumi Mānaleo no ke kama‘ilio ‘ana me nā hulu no‘eau o laila. E kipa aku nō he ho‘okahi (a ‘oi) manawa i ka hapa mua o ke kau, a he ho‘okahi (a ‘oi) manawa hou aku i ka hapa ‘elua. (‘ai)

**Ka Hana a me ka Hele Papa.** E hele mai nō i ka papa i kēlā me kēia lā, me ka mākaukau a me nā nīnau. A, pau nō ho‘i nā ha‘awina pili home ma mua o ka hō‘ea ‘ana mai. Inā hala ‘ekolu papa (‘a‘ole nānā ‘ia ke kumu), e ho‘ēmi ‘ia kāu kaha "Hana Papa" he 3% no kēlā me kēia papa i hala iā ‘oe. Inā hala nā papa he 9, he "F" ka hopena.

\*\*\* *He mau kānaka kākou, a wahi a kahiko: A hewa nō he Hale Kanaka, ‘a‘ohe hewa o ka Hale Kanaka ‘ole. No laila, inā kupu mai kekahi mea nui ma kou ola, e ‘ake‘a ana i kou hele kino ‘ana i ka papa i kēlā me kēia pule, e kama‘ilio me ke kumu. Hiki paha ke loa‘a kekahi ala e ola ai ‘oe.*

**No ka hana ‘ana i ka ha‘awina ma hope o ka palena pau.** ‘A‘ole ‘ae ‘ia, a he ‘ole (0) ka mea e loa‘a i ka haumāna. Penei no nā ha‘awina kākau, a me nā ha‘awina ‘ōlelo. Inā maopopo ‘ē iā ‘oe kekahi pilikia, a i ‘ole inā kupu mai kekahi pilikia ‘ino i hiki ‘ole ke ‘alo a‘e, e kama‘ilio me ke kumu no ka ho‘olālā hou ‘ana i kāu ha‘awina.
